

Police shut down Java child witch

POLICE in East Java have closed a clinic run by a nine-year-old child believed to possess healing powers after four people died queuing for treatment.

Two patients died on Monday while lining up with thousands of others at the house of Muhammad Ponari, who has been called "child witch doctor" by locals in Jombang district.

Ponari caused a stir among locals when he found a stone believed to have healing powers after he was struck by lightning last month.

Since then thousands of people with various ailments have visited his house every day to seek cures for various ailments.

Ponari treated his patients by dipping the stone



in water and having them drink the liquid.

It was not clear if anyone had been cured.

Korean cash says 'I love you'

CASH is the unromantic but preferred Valentine's Day gift this year as the economic downturn bites in South Korea.

In contrast to other societies, women traditionally give single men gifts to mark February 14.

The Korea Herald, citing a survey by a local match-making company, said 27% of 256 men who were interviewed opted for cash while 13% chose travel-related presents.

Twelve per cent wanted a wallet, rather than something to fill it with, but only 7% desired chocolate – the most popular gift in previous years.

"The survey results seem to reflect the current economic recession," said Hong Jung-Ok, a manager of matchmaking firm Duo Info Corp.

About a third of respondents said flowers were the last thing they wanted for Valentine's Day.
